Masks are required to be worn except while actively playing inside the court.

- **START TIME:** All participants, please arrive by 8:30 AM for warm up and to catch opening announcements. Doors will open at 7:45 AM.
- **Matches will begin as soon as courts are available.** Therefore, aside from the 9:00 AM start time, the published start times are inaccurate. Please be available to start your matches at ANY TIME.
- **Published start times will most likely move up. This compounds throughout the day, and as a result, the published end time of the tournament is later than what is most likely to occur.**
- **EVENT FORMAT:**
 - A vs X, B vs Y, C/B vs Z/X, A vs Y, C vs Z
 - A, B and C and X, Y and Z can be rearranged for each team match
 - Teams must decide before the match who is which, without knowing what the other team is doing
 - The team match ends when one team gets 3 wins

IMPORTANT HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES IN PLACE DURING EVENT!

- Masks must be worn except while actively playing
- **Spectators are limited to immediate family and coaches.** All other spectators require advance notice and a \$15 spectator fee.
- **Equipment:** all participants must supply their own racket, indoor shoes with non-marking soles, and athlete attire. Rackets must be ITTF Approved and in a condition meeting the standards of Table Tennis Canada competition.
- **Note:** some attire is prohibited altogether by the ITTF Handbook, such as non-athletic wear, shorts/shirts/skirts where the main colour is the same as the ball (white), and highly reflective jewelry
